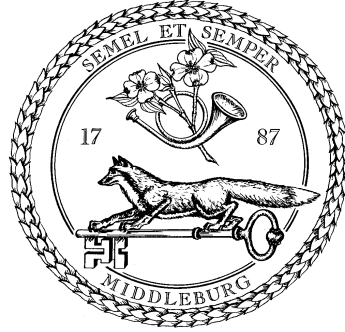

On March 23rd, Town Administrator Schiro presented Council with a draft budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009 and ending June 30, 2010. Due to the downturn in the economy and reduced real estate assessments, the Town Administrator is conservatively projecting a \$112,000 reduction in General Fund revenue. The budget, as proposed, is bare bones and

contains no real estate tax rate increases, capital improvements or employee pay increases. It does include a proposed increase in the cigarette tax and utility rates. The Council will continue to discuss the budget in the coming months; and, will hold public hearings on both the budget and tax increases. Citizens are encouraged to share their thoughts during the public hearings or with Council.

After Hours Contact—Water/Sewer Emergencies

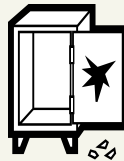

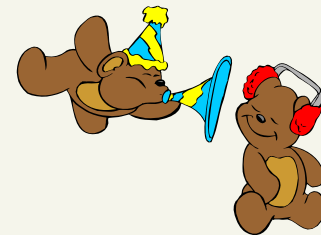

TOWN COUNCIL ADOPTS NEW NOISE ORDINANCE

In an attempt to protect its residents from excessive noise, the Town Council adopted a new noise ordinance. Copies of the ordinance are available in the Town Office.
