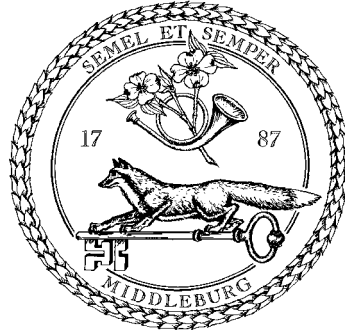

T O W N C O U N C I L A D O P T S F Y ' 1 0 B U D G E T

On June 11th, the Town Council approved a budget in the amount of \$2,248,980 for the Town of Middleburg for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010. Due to the downturn in the economy and reduced real estate assessments, the budget is \$236,620 less than the FY '09 Budget. The budget is bare bones and contains no real estate tax rate increases, capital improvements or

employee pay increases. It does include an increase in the cigarette tax, utility rates and availability fees.

The cigarette tax rate is now \$.55 per pack. The utility rates increased by 6%, resulting in a minimum bill of \$69.71 for in-town water and sewer customers. Water and sewer availability fees increased by 6% effective July 1st.
