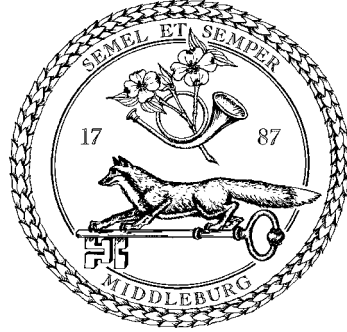

COUNCIL DEVELOPS ITS VISION THROUGH 2025

Following the second week-end retreat in as many months, the Council concluded the development of its Vision for the Town through 2025. The Vision anticipates that in 2025:

The historic business district reflects the dedication of Town leaders and citizens alike in honoring our past and anticipating our future. Through active planning the Town maintains its reputation as the Heart of Horse country, a leader in

IMPROVING MIDDLEBURG'S SIDEWALKS TOWN USES STATE GRANT

The Virginia Department of Transportation has awarded Middleburg a Transportation Enhancement Application (TEA) grant in the amount of \$144,000 for pedestrian improvements at the intersection of North Madison and

Marshall Streets. The Town Engineer, Phil DeLeon, is working with the Town staff, Planning Commission and Town Council to determine the final design for the pedestrian improvements.

Go Green Tip:
Plant a Tree. In the fall, gather acorns, chestnuts and seeds from maples and other leafy trees and plant them in small pots at home. Keep the saplings for four-five years, then plant them in your own garden, offer them to friends as gifts, or return them to nature. Experiment with different types of seeds. A single tree will absorb one ton of CO2 over its lifetime.

As a reminder, the Town Code prohibits placing waste out for collection any sooner than 3:00 p.m. on Tuesdays. Waste should be out no later than 5:00 a.m. in commercial and business areas and 6:00 a.m. in residential areas on Wednesdays.

This schedule helps to keep the Town looking nice—particularly the commercial areas where shoppers may not appreciate walking amongst garbage—and allows for the garbage to be out in time for collection.

Residents are also asked to make sure that their refuse is contained so that it does not blow around the neighborhood.
